

Q-C HOUSE OF THE WEEK

Home features alder, granite, hand-scraped oak

Today's house is a four-bedroom model home with natural stone on the front, old-style wood shutters and iron hardware. The balance of the home is sided in vinyl.

The three-car garage is built in two sections, with a one-car portion in front and a two-car portion stepped back.

The foyer floor is made of hand-scraped oak and there is a coat closet.

Ahead is the great room, with a gas log fireplace accented with stone, flanked by cabinets and shelves. A wall of windows overlooks the back yard.

The eat-in kitchen features knotty alder cabinets, granite countertops and a two-level island. Appliances are a cook top stove, stainless steel refrigerator-freezer, stainless steel microwave, conventional oven and dishwasher.

The casual dining area floor is made of hand-scraped oak and there is a French door opening to a deck.

Between the kitchen and the garage is the rear foyer with a double-wide coat closet, lockers with coat hooks, cubby holes for boots and shoes and shelf space. There also is a laundry with a clothes-folding

counter, utility sink and ceramic tile floor.

Off the kitchen is the master suite. The bedroom has a tray ceiling and with rope lighting, a wall of windows and a door opening to the deck.

The master bath features a glass-enclosed shower with a ceramic tile floor and walls, a knotty alder vanity with a granite countertop

sink, a linen cabinet and a walk-in closet. The toilet is in a separate area.

On the opposite side of the home there are two bedrooms – one set up as an office – with a full bath between them.

The lower level offers a carpeted recreation room with three windows, a 120-inch projection TV and wiring for a home heater.

This level also has an additional bedroom; a bathroom with a ceramic tile floor, antique vanity with a granite countertop sink and a shower; and unfinished storage space.

The home has nine-foot ceilings on both floors and is built to the "Silver" standard of the National Association of Home Builders green building guidelines.

Calling all bazaars!

It's that time of year – the time when nonprofit groups such as schools and churches schedule fall and holiday bazaars to raise money for worthy causes.

We're asking you to submit all of your information online. If you don't have a computer or don't have Internet access, you probably know someone who does. The deadline is Friday, Aug. 28. Here's what to do:

■ Log onto the Web site www.qctimes.com.
 ■ Scroll down to the heading "Things to do in the Quad-Cities" and click on "submit event."

■ Type in a name and e-mail address. This isn't for publication; it's just so we have someone to contact if you have a question.

■ For "title," type in "bazaar" or the name of your event. For "description," type in everything about your event – when it is (days and times), where it is (include the street address) and major items that you are selling, including meals/prices and raffle items.

■ After that, there is a space for "event date." If your event runs multiple days, type in the first day of your event and the times,

making sure to note a.m. and p.m. We'll pick up the succeeding days and times from the "description" portion of the form.

■ Next comes "event recurrence" and "event registration." You can skip both of these.

■ For "event categories," mark "Bazaar."

■ Then fill in "location information." Where it says "name," we want the name of your organization's building, St. Paul's Church or Jordan School, for example, and its street address, not your name and address.

■ If you want to include a name and telephone number or an e-mail address to appear in the paper (and on the Web site), you can type it in the "event contact info" space, but that is not required.

■ Last, but not least, click on "SUBMIT EVENT!" Otherwise all your work will be lost.

On Sunday, Sept. 13, we'll run inside the Home & Garden section a master list of all bazaars received by our deadline of Aug. 28.

Then, on every Sunday after that and continuing through the season, we will run a list of bazaars for the coming week.

This information also will be available online 24/7.

Division of perennials depends on the species

ISU Extension

Q: How often should I divide perennials?

A: The frequency of division depends on the species of plant. Most fast growing perennials, such as daylily, hosta and bee balm, can be divided every three to five years. Perennials that spread rather slowly, such as Siberian iris and peony, can be divided every five to seven years. Some perennials, like false blue indigo and gas plant, don't like to be divided and should be left undisturbed in the garden.

Cool temperatures delay tomatoes

Q: Why are my tomatoes ripening so slowly?

A: Once fruit set has occurred, it normally takes 45 to 55 days for tomato fruit to fully develop and ripen. Cool temperatures during tomato fruit development will slow maturity. Tomato fruit may require an additional seven to 10 days to mature when daytime high temperatures are consistently in the 60s and 70s.
